Of Arlington, Virginia, died November 18, 2017 at age 85 after a period of failing health.

Born in Brooklyn, New York, November 24, 1931, she was the

daughter of Pinckney Settle Hargrove, Jr. and Dorothy Mansfield Pickett Hargrove. The family moved to Lynbrook, Long Island in 1939, and she attended schools there and graduated in 1949 from Malverne High School. She studied at Buffalo State Teachers' College and graduated with a BS Degree in 1953. She taught a few years in New York public schools until going abroad to teach US Navy children in Sasebo Japan. After a year in the US she returned to teaching abroad and taught US Army children in Germany from 1961 to 1968.

After her return to the US she taught at West Springfield High School in Virginia. Her students from all these venues remember her fondly to this day and single her out as an important mentor in their lives. She became a member of the entire family of two of her students in the German-American school for over half a century.

Awarded a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship, she did further study and received her master's degree from the University of Maryland. She then taught English at Langley High School in McLean, Virginia, and eventually became its Director of Guidance, retiring in 1996. She enjoyed having a parking space labeled The DOG.

Always a good listener, her main interests were people, politics, travel, and new ideas. Ann is survived by an older sister, Virginia (Ginny) Lee Hargrove Okell, of Edison, New Jersey, and a younger sister, Sarah (Sally) Pickett Hargrove Sullivan Harris, of Weathersfield, Vermont, and by several cousins, nieces, and nephews.

Funeral services will be private.
