Lt. Col. Kip Paul Taylor ('81) was killed on September 11th. He was a Major in the Army, working in the Pentagon the day those nictures of horror were

indelibly im-



printed on all our minds. If you were at BAHS in the late seventies, early eighties, vou must remember Kip; tall, tousled, blonde hair, braces always glittering because he was always smiling. Kip was a basketball player. (I know he'd want that mentioned; even when he signed a yearbook, he always drew a picture of a basketballdunk and "Dr. K" next to his name) He was one of those rare all-around great guys without which the world would be a much more dismal place.

While living in Arlington, Virginia (a few months before moving to Athens, Greece where we are now posted). I was planning to run in the annual Army Ten Miler, October of 1999, Serendipitously. I'd just regained contact with Dean Taylor ('79), Kip's big brother, who was now, also in the Army, living in Colorado with his wife Donna. Dean came to DC to visit a few days before the race (we'd hoped he could stay for it)-and he mentioned that Kip was planning to run in it. Richard Clarke ('80) and Suzanne Stovall Clarke

('79)-ves, they're married and we've remained close friends since high school, visiting each other periodically all over the globe-were coming back for leave from Germany where Richard was posted with the Army. They would be in town to run the race too Suzanne's "little" brother, Donny '81, (now a handsome, six-plus foot, orthopedic surgeon in South Carolina) decided he'd come up and join in the run, too, My husband Tim, a Foreign Service Officer, and I had met up again with Steve Steger (*79). Steve had recently also joined the State Department and was living nearby with his wife Stacy and two children while doing his training before moving to their first post in Barbados. I told Steve that Kin was



going to be running and that it was looking like a mini-BAHS reunion (Steve and Kin were best friends in high school. In fact, we used to tease them about being "joined at the hip") ... So Steve decided to run the race, too

Richard Suzanne, Donny and I had all been on the BAHS crosscountry team together. Steve and Kip used to joke around about how easy a sport running was, that there was nothing to it. We insisted, of course, that they didn't know what they were talking about. Well, at one home race, the two spontaneously decided they'd just run along, too, to show us what they were made of. They both sprinted off like jackrabbits-as I recall, they both finished ahead of the whole boys' team-but Kip (maybe he wouldn't want this remembered) then doubled over and...lost his breakfast. And here we all were nunning another race together. twenty years later.

Race day began in a drenching downpour. Even before we reached the starting line outside the Pentagon, we were all soaked to the bone. It was a chilly, sopping but exhilarating run. Afterwards, showered and dry, we all eathered at my house as the sun emerged. We feared Kin might not make it-his in-laws were in town because his wife Nancy was due to have their first child-but, nevertheless, he showed up and with a huge bag of fresh bagels. It was wonderful to catch up. watch our children play together while we rehashed old times and

laughed about the wet morning

Richard Clarke, now living in Italy, e-mailed me four days ago telling me Kip was among the missing at the Pentagon. Until that point, I'd been weeping only for others' losses. This, as Richard wrote, hits close to home way too close.

Taken from the Washington Post on 10-6-2001:

Lt. Col. Kip Paul Taylor's 16-year ascent through the Army ranks began when he received his commission from the Reserve

Officers Training Corps at Northern Michigan University, a unit run by his father. Don.

A few months after graduation, Taylor was shipped to a base in Nuremberg, Germany, where he served for 3.5-years.

served for 3.5-years. The Michigan native returned stateside at the end of 1989 for a

15-month stint as an instructor at Fort Benjamin Harrison in Indiana. He was again sent on a foreign tour in 1991, this time as an adjutant for a task force in Honduras. After that five-month assignment, he rose to commander of a troop brigade back in Indiana, where he remained until the summer of 1994.

Taylor moved from base to base for four years before arriving at the Pentagon as executive officer in the Army's Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel in July 1998. The 38war-old carper serviceman who enjoyed running, basketball and golf in his free time, was serving as a military assistant in that office when he was killed September 11th.

"His office was on the outside ring and took a direct hit" Taylor's sister, Ann Zaenglein, was quoted as saying in USA Today. "There was nothing left of his office."

A major at the time of his death, Taylor was posthumously promoted to lieutenant colonel. He is survived by his pregnant wife and son.

Military Brats' face terror but still persevere He and I actually met and went to

horrors of terrorism, chapter and verse. Unfortunately, they have been in the midst of it more than once during their

Most recently, Jennifer experienced the gut-wrenching fear that her husband might have perished Sept. 11th when a hijacked airliner slammed into the Pentagon, where he works.

Daniel was not among the victims. But it was yet another incident in which the couple have been touched by the specter of terrorist-inflicted violence.

Unlike most young Americans, Jennifer, a former Santa Rosa County teacher, and Daniel grew up with the reality of war and terrorism all too close. It's the other side of being military brats.

high school in Berlin, Germany, during some real tough times, said Jennifer, 29. I remember Humyees with live ammunition rounds accompanying my hus to school a one in front and one

Those tough times included the 1986 terrorist bombing of a club frequented by American servicemen near the base where Jennifer and her family resided. Two were killed.

Nobody is really ready for something like that, she said. But when you're there, you are trained to deal with it.

It was simple things, like if you see book bags left on the corner or packages sitting under a car, don't touch them and notify someone immediately. If you get mail, make sure you know the return address. These are the things I was hearing growing up.

Daniel, 30, originally from Brooklyn, N.Y., is now a staff sergeant in the Air Force. He spent eight years at Hurlburt Field but has traveled half the world

and been stationed at military bases in Saudi Arabia. Italy and Cuba. He was going to Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, in 1996 when terrorists blew up

Khobar Towers, killing 19 airmen - 12 of them from Eglin Air Force Base. Military intelligence experts believe Osama bin Laden helped mastermind that bombing, just as he has been linked to the attacks on the Pentagon and the

Daniel's family heard of the Khobar attack and feared he was among those who died

World Trade Center.

He was actually at an airport in Germany. He was sitting in a United Service Organization office with fellow service members watching television when he saw news of the attack

We all looked at each other like. 'That's where we're going,' he said.

He was similarly lucky during the attack on the Pentagon. Like many

Americans, he was watching the New
York attacks unfold on TV when the
Pentagon was hit. Daniel's office is near
the south entrance, putting it on the
same side of the building where the
plane hit but several sections removed.

Everyone was glued to the television, and we beard this loud boom, he said. I didn't actually feel anything but the windows did wave slightly. When it happened, we were in shock and disbelief. It was too coincidental. Seconds later, someone was at our door telling us to evacuate?

The evacuation went smoothly, leaving Daniel outside to stare in stunned amazement at the black smoke billowing from the nation's military beadquarters. But once again, with phone lines jammed, it took several hours for him to get word to his wife. His normal 20-minute commute home took more than four hours.

As in the case of Khobar Towers, Jennifer first talked to her father in Pensacola. Ralph Allen. In 1996, the retired Army intelligence officer managed to track her down in a hotel in Mexico to tell her about the terrorist attack in Saudi Arabia. This time, Jennifer called her father from work at Johns Hopkins University, after hearing students talk about the attack on the Pentagon.

"My cell phone wouldn't dial and all circuits were busy. But I finally got through to my father in Florida, she said. I didn't have access to CNN and he said. "Well, I don't want to alarm you, (but) your husband parks on the south side and it was on that side of the

I freaked. It seared me so bad, he said. I knew it was close to his office. We were on the phone when the picture of the Pentagon came up. I told her, "I don't believe it hit his office," but I was thinking it did,

Jennifer finally heard her husband's voice about two hours later when his voice came through on her cell phone voice mail: "Hey sweetie, I'm OK. I'll talk to you soon."

Jennifer, a University of West Florida graduate and former teacher at Gulf Breeze and Navarre high schools, is now working on her doctorate through Florida State University and giving Spanish lectures at Johns Hopkins.

Her brushes with terrorism, while not diminishing the shock or horror of last week's attack, make her thoughtful. I've often wondered, if there was a great need for people to volunteer in military service or make a great sacrifice, would we be up to it? With the bombing, we're finding out.

Her husband shares her thoughts. He has heard the politicians and analysts couch the situation as the great test for a yet untested generation. He generally agrees with the analysis.

Are you ever really ready for something like this? he asked. The generation that fought World War II and those that fought World War I before them, were they up for it?

Of course.
