




BAHS' Concert and Intermediate Band started the year with a bang at the Fall Concert under the direction of Dr. Ray Lindsey.



### Advanced and Junior Vocalists Throw Open





The Putt Patrol's duties are the following: to pick up trash in the hallways, return musical instruments to the music room, return library books to the LRC, return PE equipment to the gym, return trays to the cafeteria, return school supplies to the Lost and Found, and to report all damages to the main office secretary.

Each Putt Patrol member carries a permanent pass which is good for the period he works.
