40th Anniversary

"Many happy returns to you Berlin American High School." This was what was said on October 14, 1986 to both Department of Defense schools and to BAHS. The second week of October marked 40 years of DoDDS schooling.

Thomas A. Roberts' school opened its doors to American dependents' children in 1946. The school started out with 33 students; and by the end of the year, 80 were enrolled in Grades K-12. In 1965, BAHS moved to its present location, with Grades 7-12 in attendance.

Berlin American High School presently has an enrollment of approximately 675 students. Most pupils are of military background, although students who are connected with the embassies, Pan American employees' dependents, and DoDDS civilian family member make up the total student body.

The activities held in conjunction with the anniversary included: birthday cake for all students, the releasing of balloons by the class officers, the burying of a time capsule, and an all around good time.



750 Years

This year, Berlin celebrates its 750th birthday. The city originated as a small settlement by the Spree River in the thinteenth century. Some scholars believe the name "Berlin" comes from an ancient Slavic word meaning "small dam". Berlin did not become a great city overnight. In fact, it had fewer than eight thousand people even though the city was a haven for French Huguenois and other Protestant refugees. After 1701, Kaiser Fredrick I extended Berlin to take in several outlying communities including Koln. By 1713, Berlin had more than sixty thousand residents.

Although the city was occupied during the Seven Years War and the Napoleonic Wars, Berlin continued to grow and had over 200,000 inhabitants by 1820. Sixty years later, there were more than a million.




(2) Pope's Revenge: The Pope's Revenge got its name from

the cross that appears on the ball of the tower.














(1, 2, & 3) The Berlin Wall In August, 1961, the East German government erected a barb wire fence to stop the flow of "capitalist pigs" into East Berlin, but the fine print says to keep the East Berliners from bolting to the West. Gradually the fence was replaced by a 3 meter high, 45 meter long concrete wall. Finally the East Germans mined the area by the wall; and if that is not enough, they placed towers within shooting distance of each other to stop anyone from crossing over the wall.






JOLLY GOOD TRIP

This year's tennis team, despite early losses, members kept the winning legacy of our school's team going with a 5 and 1 match record.


Six players were sent to the Wiesbaden championships, a boy's and girl's singles and doubles team.


