MEMORANDUM FOR. Members of the American Community in Berlin
SUBJECT: Anti-Vietnam Demonstrations

1. As a precautionary measure against involvement in possible demonstrations against US policy and commitment in Vietnam, all dependents and their US sponsors in the American Community in Free Eerlin are restricted from the general area of the Headquartera Compound, Saargemundestrasse, "Club 50", Shopping Center, Sports Center, T. A. Roberts School, Outpost Theater and adjacent streets between 1300 and 2400 hours on Sunday, 18 February 1968. Exceptions are authorized for those military and civilian personneil required to enter or leave the restricted area on official business.
2. Additionally, the following facilities will be closed on Sunday, 18 February at the times indicated. All other facilities will follow normal Sunday schedules, duplicate facilities are available at McNair and Andrews Barracks.

EES Gas Station - 1300 hours
Outpost Theater - all day
Sports Center and Bowling Alley - all day
