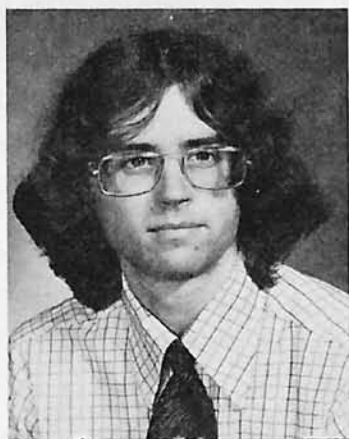
vity, to define new goals appropriate to its' times," said Ambassador Hillenbrand.
