

# Golfers claim only victory

It seems that playing on home turf is an advantage after all. The golf team, playing at home, was the only Berlin prep team to report a victory Saturday. The football teams were hosted by the International School at Brussels, and the cross-country and volleyball teams by Frankfurt.

The Berlin golfers hosted the Wuerzburg Wolves, defeating them 373 to 401. Keith Smith shot a 78 and Sara Lewkowicz scored an 88. Both men and women played 18 holes on the par 70 course.

The football teams, playing at ISB, had a less than victorious weekend. The junior varsity was defeated 8-6 with the only TD scored by Guy Marshall. The varsity squad was defeated 16-6. Berlin beat ISB in statistics but was unable to do the same in scoring. Vennie Gore scored a touchdown on a seven yard counter-play. ISB scored on Berlin's mistakes.

Cross-country competed in a four-way meet at Frankfurt Saturday against Wiesbaden, Hahn, and Frankfurt. The men were greatly improved but unable to place well against Frankfurt and Wiesbaden. Hahn did not compete in varsity. The final standing in men's varsity was Frankfurt 29, Wiesbaden 30, and Berlin 78.

The women did better with Becky Branam leading the team to a second place finish. The final standing in the women's cross-country league was Frankfurt 33, Berlin 41, and Wiesbaden 46.

The volleyball teams also played these same teams. Wiesbaden squeezed by Berlin 15-9, 13-15, 15-13. Frankfurt had less trouble, defeating Berlin 15-12, 11-15, 15-11. Berlin easily defeated Hahn 15-10, 15-1. Lisa Jones was cited by coach Alberta Barlow as playing an outstanding game, psyching out the opposition with her serves.
