If you wonder how anybody could get, some 72 teenagers and pre-teens to keep, let alone volunteer, for such grueling hours, the answer can be found in three key ingredients — an enthusiastic coaching staff, a large and active Bear-

"We work hard," said Colquhoun, an ex-swimmer, "buil don't want to come across as a machine so I try to make sure
