



Football

Berlin High School's Varsity Football Squad for 1964 presented a very commendable, if not championship, seasonal performance. In a newly jumbled conference and under an entirely new coaching staff and system, the Cubs were eked out of their 3rd consecutive championship by a team wich Berlin never even faced on the gridiron.

The Bitty Bruins started the season off very admirably with a 16-0 downing of the Wiesbaden J. V. team. Coaches Kronenberg and Esip, with technical advisor, Maj. Campbell, were allowed on the field during the game to give first-hand coaching.

The Kaiserslautern J.V.'s met the increased wrath of the little Bears and fell victim number 14, as the patented Blount-White passing combination came into being in a 27-7 victory for Berlin.

The following week spelled disaster for Berlin's first conference victims, the Bremerhaven Black-Hawks. Backs Calvert and Booth, continually pelted their defensive line to raise the Berlin yardage-gained to 402 as compared to Bremerhaven's 91, in a 33-6 victory. The inevitable ending came after Berlin established a record 15 game winning streak. The Baby Bears lost a heartbreaker to the Würzburg Wolves. The Calvert brothers and tackle John Stanturf were defensive standouts. Still unrecovered, the Cubs fought mud, rain, wind, cold and the Karlsruhe eleven. Suffering from lost spark, the Berliners stumbled in their 2nd conference game; losing the champion-ship in a narrow 14-13 upset.

The fighting spirit regained, the Cubs presented their most spectacular game against Bad Kreuznach Bearkats.

A 26-13 victory brought Berlin it's second conference win. The Cubs rolled over their season's-end victims; Bremerhaven, back for a second try, in their Homecoming Game. This 23-6 victory left Berlin with a 3-1 conference record.




