



Berlin Wall Draw Brats, Educators And Wichita Citizens Together

Formal Unveiling of the Berlin Wall In Wichita

Specifications Of The Berlin Wall Section On Display At Wichita's Museum of World Treasures

-12 feet tall, 4 feet wide, 8" depth. -The base (on the back of the Wall) is 10 feet, 4" wide, 6" depth. -Weight 4-1/2 tons. -In place August 13, 1961 to November 9, 1989.
