

1 ANNOR: (COLD) Hey, gang! It's your Teen Canteen on the Air!

2 MUSIC: OPENING THEME IN FULL TO BREAK. THEN TO BG FOR

3 ANNOR: That's right...this is your Teen Canteen on the Air! But
4 you grown-ups keep your dials tuned right where they are.
5 You'll find out what's going on at T&R High School, and the
6 things that are of prime interest to the teen-agers in town
7 this week. We'll have one of your favorite songs, the story
8 behind the sports score this week, and a lot of surprises.
9 So stay right there by your radio for the next fifteen
10 minutes... 'cause the Teen Canteen is on the Air!

11 MUSIC: UP FULL TO BREAK. THEN DOWN TO OUT UNDER

12 ANN: Hi, kids!...this is Ann Werrell, opening up another program
13 here at ARN-Berlin. We've got a lot of things to cover for
14 you this week, including an interview with our special guest.
15 Hey, Nancy Leane...have you seen him yet?

16 NANCY: Huh - uh. I just came in a minute ago, and I didn't see him
17 anywhere.

18 ANN: What about Dennis? (PIUSE) Dennis Dix! I'm talking to you!

19 DENNIS: (FADING ON) Huh? Whatta ya want, Ann?

20 ANN: Has he shown-up yet?

21 DENNIS: Has she shown up?

22 ANN: Our guest...who else?

23 DENNIS: I dunno. - I haven't seen anybody yet, except the three of us.

24 ANN: Well, I just hope he hasn't forgotten about it.

25 DENNIS: Are you kidding? After yesterday's game? How could he?

26 NANCY: Well, what are we waiting for? We've got to do something!

1 ANN: But what?

2 NANCY: (DEJECTED) I -- I don't know....

3 ANN: Dennis...it's up to you.

4 DENNIS: Me? What am I supposed to do?

5 ANN: Well....can't you say something funny?

6 DENNIS: Sure. Something funny.

7 NANCY: She's serious. C'mon, Dennis....don't just sit there -- do

8 something!

9 DENNIS: Well, what about talking like they do on the radio back home?

10 NANCY: I can't get it.

11 DENNIS: I mean, like when the announcer comes into the studio, pulls

12 up an empty microphone, sits down, and says "And now a

13 word from our sponsor". (PAUSE) Three days later, they get

14 back to the original program.

15 ANN: How comes?

16 DENNIS: Well, that word from the sponsor always starts out with a

17 real friendly question....something like, "Friends, do your

18 private parties peter out?" This gets your attention, see?

19 Then he's got you trepped. So he goes on: Have the lads

20 and lassies left you on the lurch? Do you wonder why winsome

21 women won't wander into your wiving-weem? (PAUSE) Well,

22 we'll fix that. The sponsors of our program offer now, the

23 new "Mother Bensen's Perfect paper package peerless Penny-per-

24 pound, Party-proven pecans. Your nearest market has had

25 Mother Bensen's Perfect paper package, Peerless, Penny-per-pound

1 DENNIS: (CONT'D) Tell him to get some fresh ones in!! (UP) In
2 return, we will send him a one-pound package of Mother
3 Benson's Prime Peanut Butter Party-mix to all two-headed
4 Tanguaniquans. (PAUSE) Remember...when you're in a
5 fix for a party mix, Mother Benson says: "Kats to you!"
6 And now, back to our program.

7 ANN: Well, that was interesting, Dennis, but what do we do about
8 our guest? We still haven't heard from him. How about going
9 out to the reception desk and calling his house again?

10 DENNIS: Sure. Why don't you play some music while I'm gone?

11 NANCY: Sure! We've got the top song of the week right here.

12 DENNIS: (FADING OFF) Go ahead and play it. I'll be right back.

13 ANN: What is the favorite tune this week, Nancy?

14 NANCY: It's real fine. All the kids at school said that they wanted
15 to hear it more than any other.

16 ANN: (PAUSE) Nancy....

17 NANCY: Huh?

18 ANN: What's the name of it?

19 NANCY: (NAME OF SONG)

20 ANN: Thank you.

21 MUSIC: POP TUNE IN FULL TO END

22 DENNIS: (FADING ON) Hey, he's here!

23 ANN: Who is?

24 DENNIS: Oh, no! Don't tell us you're forgotten!

25 NANCY: You don't mean our guest finally showed up?

26 DENNIS: Comes the damn! (ASIDE) Right in here, dear!

1 AL: (UP) Hi, kids!

2 TOGETHER: Hi, coach, etc.....

3 ANN: G'men in here by the microphone. We've been dying to ask
4 you some questions, Coach Kyrios.

5 AL: Aw, look...we're on the air!

6 NANCY: She means about the football team, coach.

7 AL: That's different. What d'ya want to know?

8 ANN: (AD LIB INTERVIEW) *Look on back*
9 AL:

10 ANN: Gee, that's swell, coach Kyrios.

11 NANCY: We sure are glad you could come over with us this morning.

12 AL: It was nice talking with you, kids. I'll see you in school
13 on Monday.

14 DENNIS: Right. So long, coach.

15 NANCY: 'Bye, coach.

16 ANN:

17 ANN: Well, we're right back to where we started.

18 NANCY: How do you mean?

19 ANN: Look...we still have some time before the next program comes
20 on the air, and nothing to do.

21 NANCY: Why didn't you say so? I've got a lot of things to report
22 about the kids at school this week!

23 DENNIS: Go ahead. This had better be good!

24 NANCY: It will be.....(READS REPORT OF ACTIVITIES).

25 ANN: Thanks a lot, Nancy. We'll be looking forward to another
26 report next week. Right now, though, let's take a look into

1 ANN: (CONT'D) our junior-sized crystal ball.
2 DENNIS: What for, Ann?
3 ANN: Well, every once in a while, we're going to stick our neck
4 way out, and see if we can't pick out hit tunes.
5 DENNIS: I don't get it.
6 ANN: It's simple. You and I know that a lot of new records come in
7 here to AFN-Berlin every month. Well, we'll go through them
8 and pick out one every once in a while, that the teen-agers
9 in Berlin might like. That's what we're going to do now.
10 DENNIS: Sounds like a good idea. What kind of a song is it?
11 ANN: Well, you'll find out for yourself, as soon as you hear it.
12 And here it is...one of the songs we think will be a hit in
13 the near future... *Smooth Sailing* by *Ella Fitzgerald*

22 about what you like and dislike, on one of our programs real
23 soon. And if you've got some particular problem that you think
24 other teen-agers would be interested in, send that in, too.
25 Just jot down your remarks on a postcard or a letter, and send
26 it to TEEN CANTEEN, in care of AFN-Berlin.

1 DENNIS: Hope we got a lot more mail, Ann. I sure like to hear from
2 the kids who listen to the show.

3 NANCY: Me, too.

4 ANN: I thought we lost you.

5 NANCY: Ah - uh. I just wanted to say something.

6 ANN: What's that?

7 NANCY: So long, until next week, gang!

8 MUSIC: WINDS IN FULL TO BREAK, THEN DOWN TO BG FOR

9 ANN: And that's another program, gang. This is Ann Werrell, asking
10 you to be right by your radios at eleven o'clock next Saturday.
11 Nancy Leane, Dennis, Dix, and I will be back with next week's
12 special guest, the top tune of the week, and a few surprises.
13 Remember, it's a date for next Saturday at eleven, when the
14 Teen Canteen is on the air!
