

Cubs Take Third Straight

The Berlin Cubs traveled to Karlsruhe to take on the Knights there last weekend and came back with a 28-6 victory and their record for 1966 unmarred. The Cubs stand 2-0 in the Silver Conference and are in first place.

Mustangs Get First Win With 42-6 Romp

The Berlin Mustangs waited five touched. On the conversion, Weisner games before their big win of the season—their first one—came their way, but they won impressively, as they downed the Butzbach Raiders 42-6 behind the passing of quarter-back Jerry Parker. The Mustangs, now 1-4 for the season, just outclassed the visiting Raiders in the game played on the Sports Center Field last Sunday afternoon.

The Mustangs started the action in the first quarter as they took the opening kick-off and marched the distance to the goal, with Parker scoring on a quarterback option.
The try for the extra point failed,

After Burkehart Archer picked up a loose ball in Raider territory for the Mustangs, Parker threw a pass to his end Kit Frey on a play that covered 30 yards. Ray Holmes then went around the right end on a sweep for 10 yards and the second score. Parker hit Mark Weisner on a pass over the middle for the conversion. After the Mustangs had forced the

Raiders to punt, Holmes found Frey on the halfback option and this time Frey took the ball in for the score on a pass that covered 16 yards.

After holding a 20-0 lead in the first half, the Mustangs came back in the second half and continued where they had left off. The Raid-ers received the second half kick-off and started to move before David Bloebaum intercepted a pass for the Mustangs and raced 50 yards down the sidelines before he was brought down from behind on the 10 yard line. After a series of running plays, Parker ran the quarterback option and went into the end zone un-


again took the pass from Parker across the middle.
